What this means is that starting now Palomo Farms LLC is officially authorized to sell imported hemp seeds for cultivation research purposes to farmers who have been approved by the North Carolina Industrial Hemp Commission.

Furthermore, this will help with the study of marketplace opportunities for industrial hemp products in the State, which also means more employment opportunities for North Carolinians in the future.

We are now taking preorders for the 2017 crop, with a deadline of May 5th.

HEMP AND MARIJUANA ARE THE SAME, RIGHT?

You've heard the rumors, and yes, some of them are true. Industrial hemp and marijuana *are* from the same species of plant (*Cannabis sativa*); however, the two are from different cultivars that have been bred for different uses. Unlike marijuana, the psychotropic drug, industrial hemp is cultivated for the use in the production of a wide variety of products, such as health care items, nutritional supplements, fabrics and textiles, food and beverages, and other manufactured goods.

Another difference between the two lies in its tetrahydrocannabinol, or THC, concentration. Currently, medical marijuana has a THC content anywhere between 5-20%, while industrial hemp has a THC content no higher than 0.3%.
